### BBKA CERTIFICATE FOR 50 YEARS BEEKEEPING CITATION FOR MAURICE FIELD

Maurice Field began bee keeping at school in Somerset, gaining the BBKA Junior Bee Keeping Certificate in 1961. By the late 1970s he was keeping bees in Hampshire with tuition from Sparsholt College. He obtained the BBKA Preliminary (now Basic) Certificate in 1982.

In 1985 he moved to Surrey. Over the next 20 years he expanded his hobby into a bee farming and bee keeping equipment enterprise. During this time he also led bee keeping classes in Croydon, Epsom, Tooting and Reigate.

He gained the BBKA Intermediate Certificate in 1989 and the BBKA Senior Certificate with the BBKA Practical Certificate in 1993 when he was awarded his BBKA Master Bee Keeper qualification. From 1998 to 2008 he was Beekeeping Lecturer at Plumpton College, East Sussex, leading several courses for adults based on the BBKA Syllabi up to General Husbandry level.

In 1994, his booklet "Beautiful Queens and Honey Too" was published by Northern Bee Books detailing a modern approach to F W L Sladen's method of raising queen cells in a queen-right colony using a vertical queen excluder.

He has delivered lectures at the National Honey Show and to the Central Association of Bee-Keepers. He has been a regular competitor at the National Honey show, winning several prizes in the Open and the County classes.

He now prefers to manage a few colonies for enjoyment and helping groups of local bee keepers improve their colony management skills as well as being a BBKA Assessor.

### Peter Springall

Peter died on 8th Sept 2011 after suffering a stroke,. He was 87 and had been a beekeeper for over 60 years.

Peter started keeping bees two days after he left the Royal Air Force in 1947. He was a bee breeding enthusiast, a strong advocate of the dark European honey bee (*Apis mellifera mellifera*) and had written many articles on the subject for the Bee Improvement Breeding Association (BIBBA) magazine. He lectured in bee keeping at the Kirkdale Institute in South London until 1989. It was here that he taught Norman Carreck.

Peter discovered there was such a thing as a local association some 15 years into his beekeeping and he joined the Bromley Beekeepers Association in 1962. He was the apiary manager from 1973 and the fact that he was still fulfilling this role when he died is testimony to his energy and commitment to beekeeping. The branch named their apiary after him to commemorate his 60 years of beekeeping. Peter's beekeeping drew on his background as an engineer and he made a lot of equipment himself, including his innovative resin cast jar feeder for Kirchhain nucs. He was well known for his gentle bees and he won many prizes at the National.

Peter was a kind and generous person and was always in demand on his allotment for his engineering skills and knowledge about growing vines. His other hobbies included motorbike racing, computers, jazz, dancing and latterly amateur radio. Ever forward thinking, Peter recently passed his amateur radio licence exam stating that he was looking for a new hobby, something he could do from home should his health fail and he no longer be in a position to manage his bees.

Peter had a natural ability to talk to anybody and enjoyed engaging with the public and helping others with their bee related problems. He will be greatly missed by his many friends.
