**Brenchley.** In October 2016 Jeremy Brown wrote: I have a new-ish orchard in, approx 5 acres, just between Knowle Road and Pearson Green Road, some of the trees are 4 years in the ground and we are just really harvesting our first real crop. We have 720 half standard trees in the ground, with 30 odd different varieties of apples, from cookers, to juicers to cider, with varieties like slack ma girdle, black dabinett and pitmarston pineapple, we also have pear trees, plums, damsons, quince, mulberries and greengages. We've also planted roughly 3,000 hedging plants, all UK natural hedging, I have two neighbours to the north of me and one has 3 acres and has planted 100+ trees, all cider apples and the other neighbour has nine acres but hasn't planted yet. We share mowing equipment and help each other out with planting and general maintenance.
